**Third Annual American Fine Craft Show Brooklyn at Brooklyn Museum**

**Dates:** Saturday, November 21: 11 am - 6 pm  
Sunday, November 22: 11 am - 6 pm

**Exhibiting:** Handmade ceramics, decorative and wearable fiber, furniture, glass, jewelry, leather apparel, and sculpture. The show will also highlight examples of the creative and inspired work of Brooklyn's world-renowned community of artists. There will be 90 exhibitors in all.

**Place:** Brooklyn Museum, 200 Eastern Parkway, Brooklyn, NY 11238, a few short steps from the Eastern Parkway No. 3 subway stop. Link for subway and driving directions: <http://www.brooklynmuseum.org/visit/directions.php>.

The juried fine craft show will take place in the regal third floor Beaux-Arts Court of the landmark museum. Concurrent special exhibitions include: "Coney Island: Visions of an American Dreamland, 1861-2008," which opens November 20<sup>th</sup>, "Impressionism and the Caribbean: Francisco Oller and His Transatlantic World," and KAWS: "Along the Way," featuring the work of Brooklyn-based artist KAWS.
